NUTSHELL SUMMARY:

Well acquainted with the Millard County General Plan, Land-use Ordinance(s) & other applicable ordinances and policies, including procurement policy & ordinance(s). Although my broader BA degree in Political Science covered much more than just rural planning, my senior project included an internship with the Iron County Attorney's office, focusing on land-use planning during which I drafted a county flood control plan that was ultimately adopted and implemented several years later. After serving as co-chair of the task force responsible for creation of the Kane County Water Conservancy District, I later served as executive director and general counsel for the district. Our first project, for planning purposes, was to develop a county water resource management plan. As Kane County Attorney, I re-wrote the Kane County General Plan and Land-use Ordinance. More recently, my work as general counsel for the Pole Canyon Project in Utah County included master-planning of infrastructure and land-use entitlements in Cedar Valley (between Cedar Fort and Fairfield), one of the most rural areas of Utah County, for ultimate development of a 3000 acre multi-dimensional masterplanned community, including a substantial business/industrial park. Most recently, during my tenure on the Kanosh Town Planning Commission, we completed a major overhaul of the town's General Plan, as well as development and adoption of a town subdivision ordinance, and began work on an annexation policy plan. During that same time frame I also successfully negotiated resolution of a complex and long-standing dispute between Kanosh Town and Corn Creek Irrigation Company.

The Pole Canyon Project is a large (3000 acre), multi-dimensional real estate investment project, including culinary water service provider, and multiple special service districts, located in rural northwestern Utah County between Cedar Fort and Fairfield. In addition to representing the project's culinary water service provider, and creating, expanding, contracting and ultimately dissolving several county special service districts, I was also jointly responsible for all land-use and resource master-planning, and primarily responsible for oversight of the de-annexation of portions of the project from two separate municipalities, and annexation of the entire project into a third municipality, with a new basic local district, with full zoning and land-use master-planning, pursuant to development agreement, for a master-planned community, including an intensive 1000+ acre light industrial business park, and associated commercial development. This process took seven (7) years and required resolution of multiple complex issues and disputes, without any resulting litigation.
